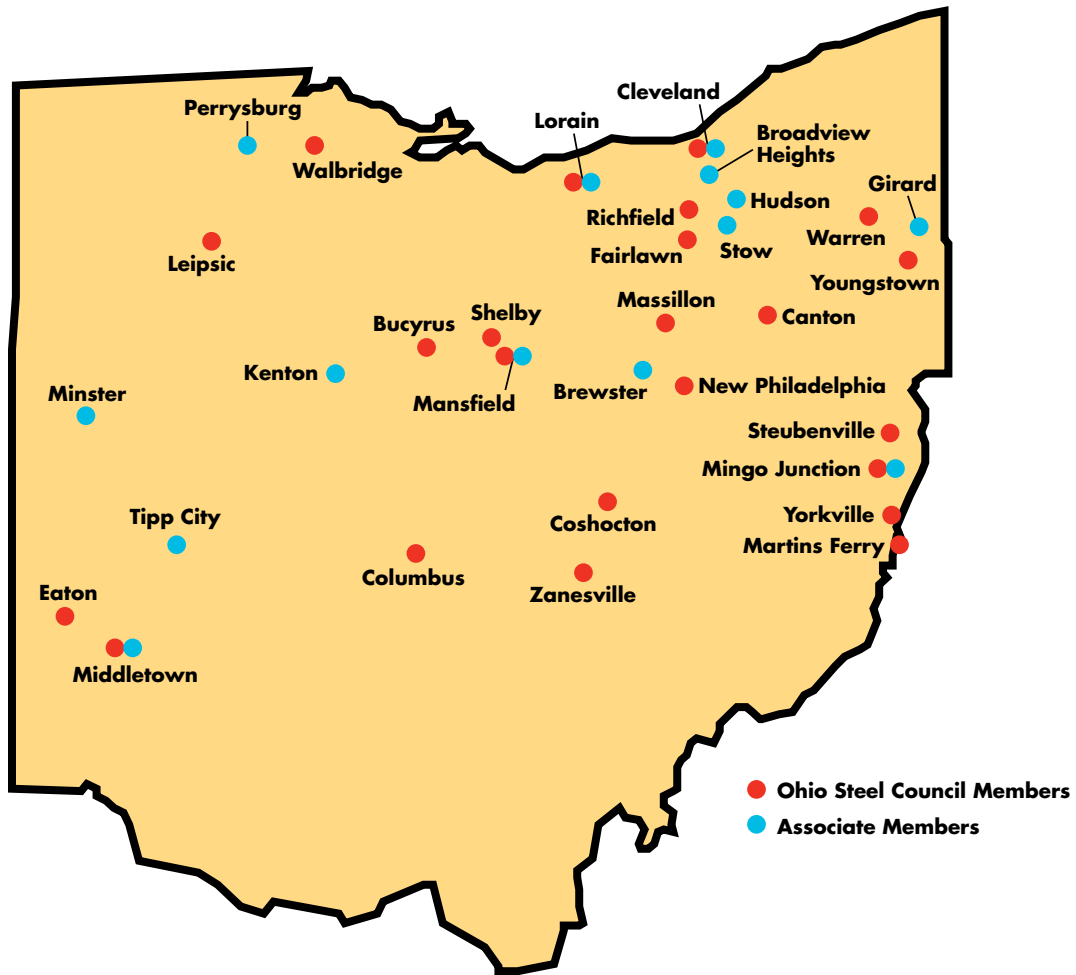

- **Ohio's Leadership in Steel Production:** Since 1892, Ohio has been a leading steel producer and today remains among the top three steel-producing states.
- **Steel Is Crucial to Ohio's Economy:** For every one job in Ohio's steel industry, another three jobs are generated. Labor income from the steel industry and industries tied to steel pump \$4.8 billion into Ohio's economy every year. Industries that sell directly to steel range from manufacturing and services to utilities and transportation.
- **Major Tax Contributor:** Steel companies annually pay \$600 million in taxes to Ohio and local communities, as well as \$700 million in federal taxes.
- **Enriching Ohio Education:** Ohio Steel Council member companies invest \$4.4 million annually in school programs and scholarships, environmental education, worker training and employee tuition.
- **Charitable Contributions:** Ohio steel producers and United Steelworkers contribute \$5.3 million to the United Way, Habitat for Humanity and other charitable organizations each year.
- **Environmentally Responsible:** Steel is the number one recycled material, outpacing paper, glass and aluminum combined. Ohio steelmakers regularly recycle steel scrap in making new steel, buying nearly 8 million tons per year from Ohio's scrap dealers, shredders and buy-back centers.
